Dating Violence – How big is the problem?

- The left graphic refers to any form of physical dating violence in the last year.
- The middle graphic refers sexual dating violence in the last year.
- The right explains that 26% of women and 15% of men who were victims of contact sexual violence, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner in their lifetime first experienced these or other forms of violence by that partner before age 18.
